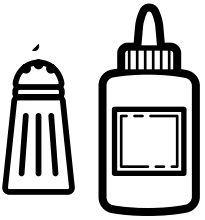
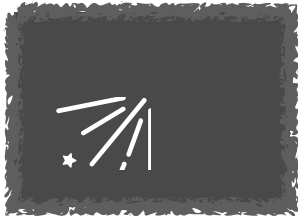
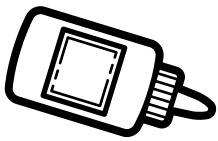


Make a fireworks scene with paper, glue, salt, and watercolors.



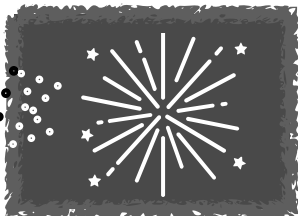
Step 1. gather

- salt for sprinkling
 - a bottle of regular, school glue
 - a thick paper or cardboard for creating a scene
- If you want to make a nighttime scene, use a dark color for your paper.*



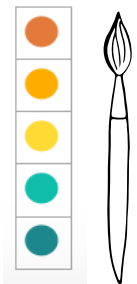
Step 2. create a picture

- draw a picture with the glue
- a fireworks pattern is made with lines radiating out of a center point
- pictures can be drawn before using the glue
- you can create any picture you like
- lines that criss-cross in the picture are fun to watch when you paint them



Step 3. sprinkle and shake

- cover the wet glue picture with salt (like glitter)
- make sure there is a pan or other paper under your picture to catch the extra salt
- shake the salt that doesn't stick to the glue off into a pan or bowl and use it for more pictures
- let the glue dry before painting



Step 4. paint the color

- using a very wet paintbrush, dip the brush in watercolor paints
- when the paintbrush touches the salt covered glue, the color will spread through the design
- keep adding layers of color in your picture until you feel it is finished
- this technique also works well with water droppers and liquid watercolors
