TRC RESIDENT PROFILE





Since she was seven years old, Chelsea Weaver knew she wanted to pursue a career in musical theater and film in New York City. In July 2022, the dream became reality when she moved into The Rehearsal Club. A 2021 graduate of Western Connecticut State University (WCSU), majoring in Theater Performance with a minor in Creative Writing, she heard about The Rehearsal Club from college friends Kelsey Lepesko and Oksana Veres, who were then living at TRC. As an actor/singer/dancer/writer, Chelsea arrived in NYC with very impressive credentials. Her performance of Queen Tatiana in *A Midsummer Night's Dream* at WCSU was named a candidate for an Irene Ryan Scholarship at the Kennedy Center American College Theatre Festival (2022).

Chelsea enthuses about what she likes best about TRC. "The workshops let us gain first-hand knowledge from people working in the field," she says, "and the relationships I have made with other residents, sharing relatable experiences and supporting each other, is really great." Workshops on writing styles and getting published, opportunities in audio books and voiceovers, and getting an agent are "invaluable" she says. She has performed in two of The Rehearsal Club showcases at Don't Tell Mama, and she also serves as a brand ambassador to Street Meet Productions, talking to visitors about Broadway plays including *Outsiders, Hell's Kitchen* and *Water for Elephants,* which keeps her up-to-date on the Broadway scene.





Celia Weston, born in Spartanburg, South Carolina, has had a fulfilling career on stage and screen. She studied at North Carolina School of the Arts and at the Bruford School in London. She then headed to the Big Apple, where she was introduced to The Rehearsal Club by her summer stock theatre colleague, Patricia Cody, a dancer and now attorney! After submitting a resume and reference letters, she auditioned and was immediately embraced by the ladies at the Club. Her first day in NYC, TRC member (and fellow NCSA alum), Joyce Reehling, introduced Celia to casting

agents. Three days later Celia got her first role in an Equity production of Woody Allen's *Play It Again, Sam.* In 1979 she was cast in her Broadway debut, *Loose Ends*,

starring Kevin Kline. Her next Broadway role was in Edward Albee's play *The Lady from Dubuque*, starring Irene Worth. In 1998 Celia received a Tony Award nomination for Alfred Uhry's play *The Last Night of Ballyhoo*, as well as winning the Outer Critics Circle Award. Other nominations include the Drama Desk and Drama League Awards as Best Supporting Actress. She is proud to have been in the Broadway production of Sam Shepard's play *True West* in 2000, which starred Philip Seymour Hoffman and John C. Reilly. Her most recent Broadway appearance was in *Marvin's Room* at the Roundabout Theatre, where she also did Tennessee Williams' *Summer and Smoke*.

For her performance in the multi-Oscar-nominated film *Dead Man Walking*, starring Susan Sarandon and Sean Penn, Celia received an Independent Spirit Award nomination. She was nominated for the Screen Actors Guild award for Best Acting Ensemble for *In the Bedroom*, with Sissy Spacek, Tom Wilkinson, and Marisa Tomei.

In television, Celia is known for the character Jolene Honeycutt on the CBS hit sitcom *Alice*, from 1981 to 1985; *Modern Family* (as Cam's mom), *Frasier*, *The Thing About Pam*,(as Renee Zellweger's mother), *American Horror Story, Hunters* and *Law & Order/SVU*.

Two upcoming films include a comedy due out in January starring Will Ferrell and Reese Witherspoon titled *You're Cordially Invited*, in which Celia plays Reese's mother, and *A Little Prayer*, a family drama with David Strathairn.

Celia's advice to young artists is to always be prepared for an opportunity to win the job. She will always be thankful for The Rehearsal Club! She calls it a halfway house for NICE girls!




