# 2025 THEME "Moving Forward Together! Women Educating & Inspiring Generations"

In 1848, a Women's Rights Convention was held by Elizabeth Cady Stanton and Lucretia Mott in Seneca Falls, NY. The agreed upon outcome was a publication of sixteen demands of rights known as a Declaration of Sentiment. However, not until 1909 was a National Women's **DAY** declared in America.

The progression from DAY to WEEK to MONTH began when President Jimmy Carter, in 1980, proclaimed March 2-8 National Women's History WEEK, and in 1987, when Congress declared there should be a celebration every March for Women's History MONTH.

However, I would be remiss to have not mentioned an activist/women's rights advocate, Clara Zetkin, of Germany. In 1910, Clara organized a Conference of Working Women to be held in Copenhagen. On the agenda was her promotion that a Women's Rights DAY should be celebrated internationally. Those attendees - from many European countries - went home to do just that.

I mention the above goings-on in Europe because it was that which caught the attention of California educators in 1978 and inspired them to expand the celebration throughout the school district of Sonoma County. Various events were planned, including a parade through downtown Santa Rosa, CA.

Today, whether the celebration lasts a day, week or month, nationally or internationally, there is no question that we women of TRC Corporation (with it's merger of Rehearsal Club Alumnae) also identify as Women's Rights Advocates in celebration.


