TRC REVIVES THE BELOVED WARDROBE SALE!





September's Newsletter Spotlight Focuses on TRC new Board Member, Sheryl Simms-Foster. Sheryl serves on TRC's Finance and Development Committees and has been hard at work on the Gala.

Sheryl lived at the Club in 1969 and 1970. She grew up in Biloxi, Mississippi and was encouraged by a local patron of the arts to move to NYC and to connect with Lou Wilson. Wilson was a very successful figure in the NYC

theater world, as well as being on the Board of the Rehearsal Club. Wilson helped Sheryl to become a Resident. She lived in a room that faced 53rd Street, and she often stayed up late into the night looking at the beautiful city lights. Sheryl was at the Club for a year, experiencing

various jobs and adventures. She met her husband, Dean Foster, a musician working at a Greenwich Village Club. They have been married 52 years and have two children, Leah and Noel, and 3 grandchildren.

During her career, Sheryl toured in a rock version of *Antigone*, appeared in soap operas and did product modeling as well as other projects. A highpoint was a TV film with her daughter, Leah, in Judy Blume's *Otherwise Known As Sheila The Great*. They played mother and daughter.

Sheryl and her husband ran a very successful singing telegram business, Musicbox, featured on every media outlet, including *The Tonight Show Starring Johnny Carson.* Their next business endeavor was intercultural training for companies doing business globally, Dean Foster Global Intercultural Solutions. Sheryl has travelled to sixty-five countries and all seven continents.

Sheryl is retired and still involved in the arts. She works in photography and had a photo featured in *National Geographic Magazine*. She has also written a book for middle school children, *The Mardi Gras Mystery*. After leaving the Rehearsal Club, Sheryl never left NYC; she has a treasured home in Brooklyn.

Thank you to TRC Charter Alum Patricia Hill for organizing and producing a very successful event in Malibu on August 19th celebrating the publication of *Cinderellas of West 53rd Street*.

Actor, author and historian Kerry Slattery started the celebration with the story of The Rehearsal Club's origins in 1913. After an explanation of the 30's movie and Broadway show *Stage Door*, by Edna Ferber, which was based on The Rehearsal Club, we heard the soulful voice of Christopher Callan singing *Broadway Baby*.

Moving into the 1950's, Betty Bigger's tale of being strangled and of Ed Sullivan helping her get into the Club was read by Dorothy Polash. Dorothy, who traveled from San Francisco just to watch and reconnect, jumped into understudy mode when Annie O'Donnell booked an Amazon commercial. Dorothy nailed it. Dorothy is a Democratic fundraiser in San Francisco, and we're hoping she picks up singing again soon.

Next, Christopher Callen shared her adventures. She came to TRC because of her friendship with Kerry Slattery. She even officiated at Kerry's wedding.

Patricia Hill shared her experiences in that old 1870's Brownstone with all its magic and lifelong friends, and where her professional life changed to cinematography.

Our Emmy Award winning Melanie Mayron's story is like watching acting perfection. She has been directing so much lately, it is easy to forget how exceptional her talents really are.

DeBorah Sharpe-Taylor was one of the very last women to stay at the Rehearsal Club, in 1979. Besides her amazing singing voice, she also jumped in as technician for playback and background music.
