

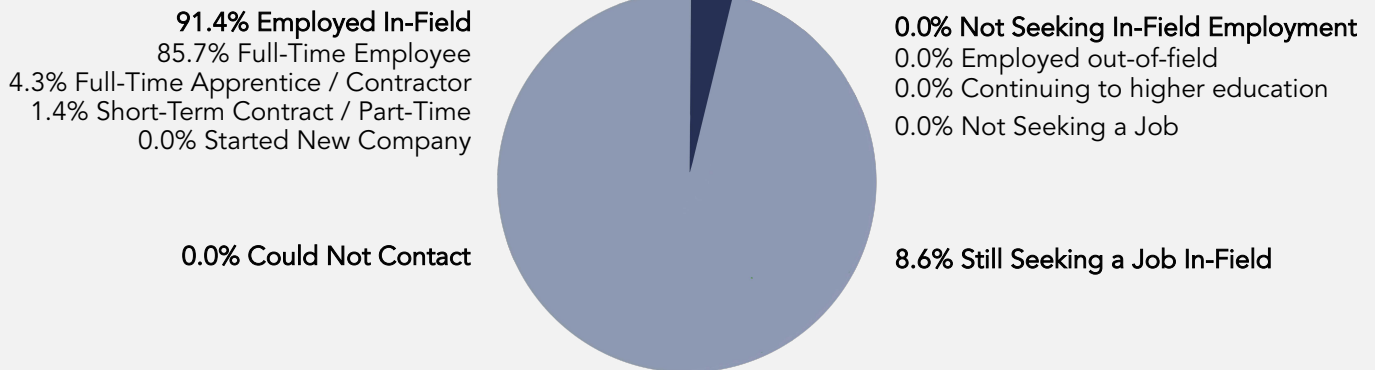

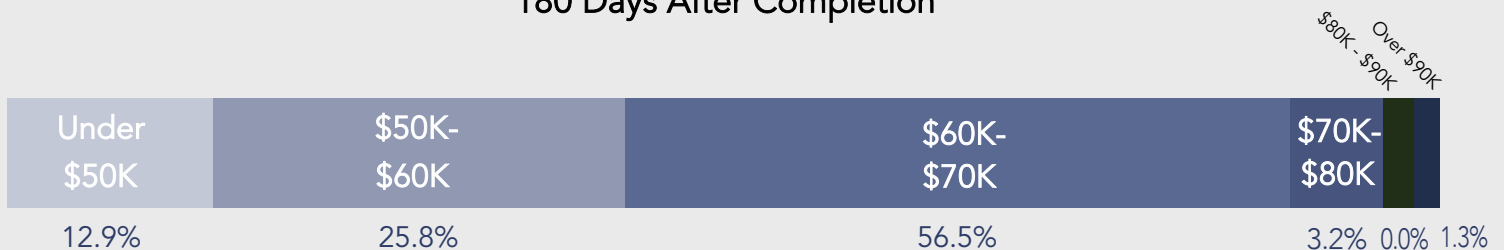
What were the employment results for graduates?
