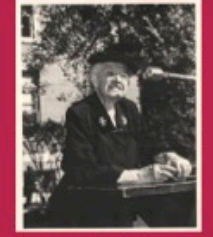

**On November 7th, 1871 . . .  
Florence R. Sabin was born**

"I hope my studies may be an encouragement to other women, especially to young women, to devote their lives to the larger interests of the mind. It matters little whether men or women have the more brains; all we women need to do to exert our proper influence is just to use all the brains we have."

– Florence Sabin, accepting the Pictorial Review achievement award in 1929

Florence Rena Sabin (1871-1953) was an American anatomist and medical researcher. Her excellent and innovative work on the origins of the lymphatic system, blood cells, and immune system cells, and on the pathology of tuberculosis was well-recognized during her lifetime. She was also a trailblazer for women in science: the first woman to hold a full professorship at Johns Hopkins School of Medicine, the first woman elected to the National Academy of Sciences, and the first woman to head a department at the Rockefeller Institute for Medical Research. In her retirement years, she pursued a second career as a public health activist in Colorado, and in 1951 received a Lasker Award for this work.

Florence Sabin was a firm believer in equal opportunities for women. During her time at Johns Hopkins, her friends included women physicians and women's rights activists. She helped them with letter-writing campaigns for the National Women's Party, and editorial work for a weekly suffrage newspaper. Between 1900 and 1910, she also donated her time to the Evening Dispensary for Working Women and Girls, and became good friends with the Baltimore women physicians who founded it. Only rarely, however, did she neglect her scientific work to march in suffrage parades.
