

The Saluda Community Land Trust (SCLT) is dedicated to preserving Saluda's small town character by protecting its unique natural heritage.

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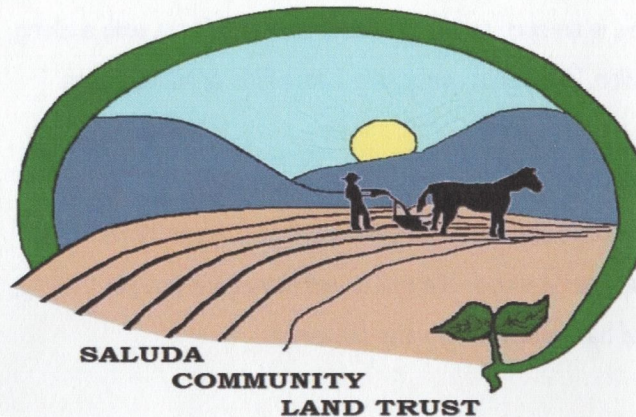
