

Volunteer in the Kid's Plot at the Robinson Community Garden

Driving Directions:

The garden is located on the corner of Henderson and Poplar Streets. From the Saluda Library go up Carolina Street past the Saluda Presbyterian Church and make a left on Henderson Street. The road will make a gentle right and the garden will be visible at the next corner.

The Kid's Plot is the one closest to the Robinson Community Garden sign. The black gate opens at the left. Please stay on the mulched path.

Service projects include:

- planting young plants and seeds
- weeding
- adding leaf mulch to the beds
- adding bark mulch to the paths
- creating garden signs and markers for the plants

Educational Information:

The Robinson Community Garden was created in 2008 as a place for both children and adults to garden. Pat and Marcus Robinson lease the land to the Saluda Community Land Trust and in 2018 granted permission for year-round gardening.

The Robinson family had a garden here for many years. Originally a livery stable was on the site. A livery stable was a place where horse owners paid a fee to have their horses fed and cared for. Therefore horse manure made for very fertile soil.

SCLT member Dave Prudhomme devised and helped install an effective watering system that collects water from the roof of the white house behind the garden. Water is stored in large open containers and used to water the garden during dry periods of no rain.
