Lone Star Leadership Academy summer camps: Outstanding 4th-8th graders from across Texas meet in Dallas/Fort Worth, Austin/San Antonio, or Houston/Galveston for a week of fun, learning, leadership development, and visits to unique and historically significant Texas destinations with Texas teachers. **Served: 1,127 students in 2018; 14,366 students since 2002.**

Lone Star Leadership Academy Alumni Council: Camp alumni exercise leadership by creating and leading service projects in their communities. Council members have the opportunity to return to camp in leadership role as Youth Facilitators. **Served: 72 students in 2018; 1,170 students since 2004.**
