2025 HVAC Service Rebate

HVAC tune-up and maintenance helps to keep heat pump and central air conditioning units operating at top efficiency, prevents equipment failure, and extends the life of the unit. A tune-up by a service professional can improve unit efficiency by as much as 20%.

An annual HVAC tune-up includes, but is not limited to, checking and correcting the unit's refrigerant pressure and tubing, checking and adjusting belt tension, cleaning, lubricating, and adjusting the indoor blower unit and outside coil and straightening fins, replacing filters, cleaning inside the "A" coil, cleaning the inside coil, condensation pans, condensate traps, and condensation lines, checking the refrigerant levels and if low, finding and repairing the leak, and checking the thermostat, wiring, and other electric parts.

HILCO Electric Cooperative will reimburse members up to \$50 for having a licensed contractor perform a HVAC tune-up during 2025. To receive the rebate, simply complete and attach this form to a copy of your receipt. The receipt must contain the license number of the qualified contractor and the contractor's certification that the maintenance performed was classified as a "yearly maintenance intended to make the unit more efficient" and reimbursement request must be postmarked within sixty days from the date of service. Reimbursement requests received without all required information, such as contractor license number and date of service, will not be considered and rebate will not be issued. Commercial builders are not eligible for rebates. Permanent residents or occupants may apply.
