

- ***Be First**
- ★Be Fair
- *Be Flexible

Be First

- ***Set the mood**
- *Set the pace
- ***Set the standard**

Be Frank

- *Affirm the facts
- *Agree on the issue/problem
- ***Explore for a solution**

Be Fair

- *Share the credit
- *Take the heat
- *Don't play favorites

Be Flexible

- *Achieve consensus
- *Encourage fresh thinking
- *Admit when you are wrong

Leader v. Follower Motivation


- A leader is motivated from within
