Primary, Secondary, and Tertiary.



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Source Evaluation

Evaluate the credibility of sources.

- **Reliability** – how dependable, current, and representative is the source
- **Relevance** – how well does the source/data relate to your objectives/issue
- **Adaptability** – how well can the source/data be adapted to your topic or business problem
- **Expertise** – what is the skill and background of the people creating the source/data
