What is Inclusive Teaching?

 Inclusive teaching refers to pedagogy that strives to serve the needs of all students, regardless of background or identity, and support their engagement with subject material (Yale)

 ...deliberately cultivating a learning environment where all students are treated equitably, have equal access to learning, and feel valued and supported in their learning (The University of Michigan)

What is Inclusive Teaching?

- □ Inclusive language
- Accessible videos/audio including closed captions
- The avoiding of voiding microaggressions
- Knowing names and correctly pronouncing them
- Avoiding tokenizing identities
- Readings from a variety of identities and perspectives
- □ Respecting pronouns

- Representing a variety of identities in classroom examples (images, names, stories)
- Using assignments/activities that cater to a variety of different learning styles
- Incorporating diverse perspectives

- Increased sense of belonging

- Higher levels of satisfaction in the course
