# Let the Cat Out of The Bag! – Raising Intercultural Awareness with Hedgehog, Giraffe and Co.

#### **TIPS FOR INSTRUCTORS**

- Tell your students that this is a "team building exercise" and that they will receive a cooperative task that they have to solve together as a group (see task sheets below).
- Have them go together in groups of 4-5
- Make sure that each group receives one task sheet, that each group has a different animal, and that students cannot see the other groups' instructions to avoid giving away the fact that they all have to draw different animals.
- 1st round = training round
   Students are allowed to communicate openly about strategies to develop the most efficient strategy.
- 2nd = timed round → NO TALKING!
  - The no talking rule is essential because the simulation will not work if students realize too early that they have been drawing different animals
  - Tell students to use the back of the task sheet for their drawing
- 3rd round = simulation round (also timed) → STILL NO TALKING ALLOWED!

  Tell students that they did so well that you will now raise the difficulty by having one person from each group move one group further
  - → IMPORTANT: Make sure that you collect all the used task sheets with the instructions and the previous drawings and give students a new (empty) piece of paper for the third round; tell them the task remains the same.
- Discuss impressions, e.g. using these discussion prompts:
  - ✓ What were your impressions? As established group with a fixed strategy / As a newcomer to the group?
  - ✓ Which strategies did you use to solve the task?
  - ✓ How was the newcomer integrated?
  - ✓ Does the newcomer first observe what is going on or does s/he just join the group and draw with them?
  - ✓ What happens if the cat suddenly looks like a hedgehog?
  - ✓ Do the others explain the rules non-verbally?
  - ✓ Which strategies did the group develop to integrate the newcomer?
  - ✓ Which strategies did the newcomer develop to fit in with the group and adapt to the new rules?
- → Consider: Expectation of "normality": What is "normal" and what is considered to be "natural" or "self-evident" may differ substantially depending on culture!



#### **S**UGGESTIONS TO FACILITATORS

- To achieve maximum learning impact, lead a guided discussion in class about outcomes (see discussion prompts above).
- Also point out similarities and draw parallels between the simulation and actual intercultural encounters.
- You may additionally ask students to reflect on the assignment and their reactions and feelings in the form of a short essay or a recounted Think-Aloud-Protocol. This helps them to organize and outline their thought processes and emotional reactions.
- Ask your learners to change perspective and include their thoughts about the respective other role's (as newcomer / as member of the established group) feelings during the exercise.
- This exercise may serve as an introduction to a more in-depth case study taking place in an international business context, sensitizing students for the possibility of different perspectives and expectations of normality in the international environment.








### Task: Draw a CAT together.

- Hand around the pen clockwise.








## Task: Draw a GIRAFFE together.

- Hand around the pen clockwise.








### Task: Draw an ELEPHANT together.
