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CUBS Camp Counselor

Program Dates: July 5-August 12, 2016; Mandatory training prior to start of camp TBA

Qualifications:

1. A camp counselor must be at least 18 years old. One year of college education and past experience in camp counseling preferred.
2. High School and/or college sports experience.
3. Experience working with or supervising children needed.
4. Must be in good academic standing. Study in education/PE preferred.
5. Ability to enforce camp rules and regulations while supervising campers ages 6-12.

Compensation:

Compensation is \$290-350/week based on prior experience at Cornell's Sports School or other related camp/education experience. Lunch is provided each day.

General Responsibilities:

1. Lead, guide and supervise a group of 8-10 children in sports activities from 8:45 a.m.-4:40 p.m. Monday-Friday. Additional assignment of before and after camp care duty required (on a rotating schedule with other counselors) from 7:30 a.m.-5:30 p.m.
2. Assist with demonstrating sport skills and teaching rules of play.
3. Assist with camp registration and interaction with parents.

Specific Responsibilities:

1. Man a table or station at camper registration.
2. Supervise and oversee camper safety during daily sports activities, swimming and lunches. Each counselor will be responsible for the supervision of approximately ten campers.
3. Assume responsibility for the safety, physical care and discipline of campers.
4. Enforce the health and safety regulations of the New York State Dept. of Health and the Summer Sports School. Report all health needs of campers to appropriate medical staff.
5. Other camp duties as assigned by the CUBS Camp director.
