Since 2010, the Texas Children in Nature (TCiN) network has strengthened and leveraged partnerships and regional collaboration, to improve the connection between children and nature. The results of our collective impact continue to grow.

During this two-day Summit, TCiN will bring together the health, education, built environment, faith, and conservation community leaders to shape an even brighter future for the children of Texas. TCiN will convene over 250 thought leaders to strengthen the network and develop opportunities and policies that will connect more children and families with nature.

Children today spend between 7 and 11 hours per day indoors, sedentary, with media and only minutes per day playing in nature. At the same time research shows that childhood obesity, diabetes, and depression are also on the rise. The trends are alarming. The good news is that this is a solvable problem.

TCiN continues to see real progress towards solutions through community collaboration. Join us in this journey to connect more children and families with nature.

The 2017 Champions were:

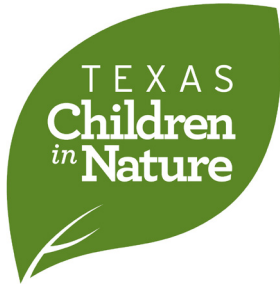
Peggy Carnahan – For the creation of Project ACORN and as a lifelong educator who believes all lessons can be taught outdoors. She is the Director of the Center for Mathematics at Our Lady of the Lake University.

San Antonio Zoo - For their innovations in creating a sense of place children at the Tiny Tots Nature Spot, and Zoo Pre-School, while also exposing them to nature from around the world.

Texas Wildlife Association – For their vision to support private landowners who wish to share their passion for hunting and heritage with kids through their Youth Hunting programs, and for their dedication to conservation education.

City of San Antonio – For the myriad of opportunities they provide to children and families to improve their health while enjoying and learning about the natural resources around the city. Programs such as Starting Out Wild and the Mayor's Fitness Council have all contributed to the health and wellness of the families of San Antonio.

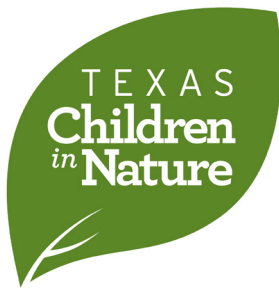
