With parent conferences just around the corner, I found this article to be timely and wise.

At St. George's, our teachers use a variety of methods to collect data on your children's growth and development. Through observations, anecdotes, work samplings, and development checklists the teachers do their best to represent your child and to listen to your viewpoints or concerns.

We our one of your child's first advocates, along side you, the parents. And we value the opportunity to report on what we observe to support your child's future growth, development, and learning.
