Financial Facts about St. George's School

In most years, the school raises tuition to stay competitive with salaries and inflation. Last year was the first significant tuition increase in several years, so this year's tuition increase (see link below) is higher than normal to stay on track with our strategic plan. This increase was voted on by the school's Board of Directors after extensive consideration and research. The strategic plan sent out last month indicates that one of our goals in the strategic area of faculty and staff is to have a highly qualified staff that is appropriately compensated.

To obtain this goal and retain staff, this price increase is necessary. The tuition increase last year went directly to staff compensation, but it only increased the <u>average</u> hourly rate to \$19, which was still <u>below</u> the average in other comparable schools.

The staff and faculty are what makes our school so unique, and we've been fortunate to retain such great staff so the children can experience the highest level of care and education. Even though the staff and faculty live so far from the school, they love the work environment, families, and of course, the children, so they are willing to make the commute.

I am sensitive to the impact this can have on our families, and I pray you will find the value in the level of expert care we provide. Many schools in Austin are faced with the same decisions and struggle with these tough decisions. I sit in on many educational advisory groups and have listened to their concerns about the rising cost of child care and what decisions they are making to keep up in the upcoming school year.

To close out this topic, I would like to remind everyone that the school does offer financial assistance. I am attaching the policy <a href="here">here</a>.

- Online enrollment is first come first serve and will be time-stamped
- Priority enrollment is as follows:
  - Monday, Feb. 19 EB and/or FZ currently enrolled families

  - Wednesday, Feb. 21 siblings of currently enrolled and church parishioners
  - Thursday, Feb. 22 current wait-listed families
  - Friday, Feb. 23 community at large
