It Starts With Soccer (ISWS) is committed to providing children in rural Africa the opportunity to get a good education not only in the classroom, but also in real world situations through job skills training. ISWS addresses both by providing rural communities with sustainable school farms (including greenhouses, community gardens, orchards, and livestock farms) and educational supplies. The orchards are a new addition. Not only do they provide food for the students and community, but also provide shade so other crops in the outdoor gardens can thrive in their increasingly drier climate. ISWS uses soccer clinics at rural schools to relate the beloved sport to the importance of teamwork and getting a good education. The non-profit was founded by Doug Brown, son of Bill & Becky Games. Pastors Nicka and Talent, who operate the ministry in Zimbabwe, blessed WUMC with a visit and discussion of their work in April.
