

INSTALLATION OF REV. CRAIG CHAPMAN AS ASSOCIATE PASTOR

THE PRESENTATION OF THE CANDIDATE

QUESTIONS TO THE CONGREGATION

Minister: To you, members of All Saints Presbyterian Church, as a member of South Texas Presbytery, I present Rev. Craig Chapman to be installed as Associate Pastor. Has he been called in accordance with the standards of this church?

People: He has.

Minister: Do you, the people of this congregation, continue to profess your readiness to receive Craig, whom you have called to this position?

People: We do.

Minister: Do you promise to receive the word of truth from his mouth with meekness and love and to submit to him in the due exercise of discipline?

People: We do.

Minister: Do you promise to encourage him in his labors, and to assist his endeavors for your instruction and spiritual edification?

People: We do.

Minister: Do you engage to continue to him while he serves in this capacity, that competent worldly maintenance which you have promised, and to furnish him with whatever you may see needful for the honor of religion and for his comfort among you?

People: We do.

QUESTIONS TO THE CANDIDATE

Minister: Craig, are you now willing to serve this congregation as an associate pastor, agreeable to your declaration in accepting its call?

Candidate: I am willing and ready to do so.

Minister: Do you conscientiously believe and declare, as far as you know in your own heart, that, in taking upon you this charge, you are influenced by a sincere desire to promote the glory of God and the good of the Church?

Candidate: I do and I solemnly declare that I believe the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the Word of God, and to contain all things necessary to salvation; and I do solemnly engage to conform to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of The Presbyterian Church in America.

THE CHARGE AND VOWS

Elder: My brother, the Church is the family of God, the body of Christ, and the temple of the Holy Spirit. All baptized people are called to make Christ known as Savior and Lord, and to share in the renewing of his world. Now you are called to work as pastor, teacher, and counselor, together with your Session and fellow ministers, and to take your share in the councils of the church. As pastor, it will be your task to proclaim by word and deed the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and to fashion your life in accordance with its precepts. You are to love and serve the people among whom you work, caring alike for young and old, strong and weak, rich and poor. You are to preach, to declare God's forgiveness to repentant sinners, to pronounce God's blessing, to share in the administration of Holy Baptism and in the celebration of the mysteries of Christ's Body and Blood, and to perform the other ministrations entrusted to you. In all that you do, you are to nourish Christ's people from the riches of his grace, and strengthen them to glorify God in this life and in the life to come.

Elder: Are you persuaded that God has called you to the office of elder?

Candidate: I am so persuaded.

Elder: Do you solemnly promise that, by the assistance of the grace of God, you will endeavor faithfully to discharge all the duties of a pastor to this congregation, and will be careful to maintain a deportment in all respects becoming a minister of the Gospel of Christ, agreeable to your ordination engagements?

Candidate: I do.

Elder: Will you respect and be guided by the pastoral direction and leadership of your Senior Pastor and Session?

Candidate: I will.

Elder: Will you be diligent in the reading and study of the Holy Scriptures, and in seeking the knowledge of such things as may make you a stronger and more able minister of Christ?

Candidate: I will.

Elder: Will you endeavor so to minister the Word of God and the sacraments of the New Covenant, that the reconciling love of Christ may be known and received?

Candidate: I will.

Elder: Will you undertake to be a faithful pastor to all whom you are called to serve, laboring together with them and with your fellow ministers to build up the family of God?

Candidate: I will.

Elder: Will you do your best to pattern your life and that of your family in accordance with the teachings of Christ, so that you may be a wholesome example to your people?

Candidate: I will.

Elder: Will you persevere in prayer, both in public and in private, asking God's grace, both for yourself and for others, offering all your labors to God, through the mediation of Jesus Christ, and in the sanctification of the Holy Spirit?

Candidate: I will.

Elder: May the Lord who has given you the will to do these things give you the grace and power to perform them.

THE PRAYER OF CONSECRATION AND INSTALLATION

AT THIS POINT THE ELDERS WILL LAY HANDS UPON THE CANDIDATE AND THE CONGREGATION WILL STAND.

Minister: God and Father of all, we praise you for your infinite love in calling us to be a holy people in the kingdom of your Son Jesus our Lord, who is the image of your eternal and invisible glory, the firstborn among many brethren, and the head of the Church. We thank you that by his death he has overcome death, and, having ascended into heaven, has poured his gifts abundantly upon your people, making some apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry and the building up of his body.

We pray to you, Lord Christ, for All Saints Presbyterian Church and the Presbyterian Church in America, that they may be filled with truth and love, and be found without fault at the Day of your Coming.

People: *Lord, hear our prayer.*

Minister: For all members of your Church in their vocation and ministry, that they may serve you in a true and godly life, we pray to you, O Lord.

People: *Lord, hear our prayer.*

Minister: For Craig, chosen Associate Pastor of All Saints, we pray to you, O Lord.

People: *Lord, hear our prayer.*

Minister: That he may faithfully fulfill the duties of this ministry, build up your Church, and glorify your Name, we pray to you, O Lord.

People: *Lord, hear our prayer.*

Minister: That by the indwelling of the Holy Spirit he may be sustained and encouraged to persevere to the end, we pray to you, O Lord.

People: *Lord, hear our prayer.*

Minister: For his family, that they may be adorned with all Christian virtues, we pray to you, O Lord.

People: *Lord, hear our prayer.*

Minister: For all who fear God and believe in you, Lord Christ, that our divisions may cease and that all may be one as you and the Father are one, we pray to you, O Lord.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Minister: For the mission of the Church, that in faithful witness it may preach the Gospel in Austin and to the ends of the earth, we pray to you, O Lord.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Minister: Therefore, Father, through Jesus Christ your Son, give your Holy Spirit to Craig; fill him with grace and power, and equip him to minister in your Church. May he exalt you, O Lord, in the midst of your people; offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to you; boldly proclaim the gospel of salvation; and rightly administer the sacraments of the New Covenant. Make him a faithful pastor, patient teacher, and wise counselor. Grant that in all things he may serve without reproach, so that your people may be strengthened and your Name glorified in all the world. All this we ask through Jesus Christ our Lord, who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God, for ever and ever.

People: Amen.

Minister: Craig, receive the Holy Scriptures. Feed the flock of Christ committed to your charge, guard and defend them in his truth, and be a faithful steward of his holy Word and Sacraments.

I now pronounce and declare that Rev. Craig Chapman has been regularly elected, ordained, and installed an associate pastor of this congregation, agreeable to the Word of God, and according to the Constitution of the Presbyterian Church in America; and that as such he is entitled to all support, encouragement, honor, and obedience in the LORD: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. ✠ Celebrant: All glory be to you, Almighty God, our heavenly Father, which of your tender mercy, did give your only Son Jesus Christ, to suffer death upon the cross for our redemption; who made there, by the offering of himself once for all, a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice for the sins of the world; and did institute in his holy Gospel, a perpetual meal in honor of his precious death and sacrifice, until his coming again.

Celebrant: We now celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

People: *Gracious God, pour out Your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these Your gifts of bread and wine, that the bread we break and the cup we bless may be the communion of the body and blood of Christ. By Your Spirit make us one with Christ, that we may be one with all who share this feast, united in ministry in every place. As this bread is Christ's body for us, send us out to be the body of Christ in the world.*

Celebrant: All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.
