

OHOH Oklahoma Leaders Tour (Native Americans)

OVERVIEW

The Oklahoma Hall of Fame Leaders tour focuses on groups of Oklahomans that have had a significant impact on Oklahoma. The groups we focus on are Native Americans, Women, and African Americans. These lessons help students develop an understanding and appreciation of the historic and contemporary racial, ethnic, and cultural groups of Oklahoma (OAS HLCS 4.11). Many of the individuals mentioned in this lesson will be emphasized on your tour. Use these companion lessons as a guide to customize this experience for YOUR classroom. You are the expert. Each lesson is accompanied by a PowerPoint presentation that has pictures and links to videos and resources that you may want to use. There are recommended readings included in the lesson that should be in your school library as the Oklahoma Hall of Fame has gifted all Oklahoma schools these books.

SUGGESTED QUESTIONS AND DISCUSSION PROMPTS

INTRODUCTION	Intro: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ask your students to create a list of leaders by using the discussion prompt and brainstorming together. Encourage students to come up with leaders from a wide range of fields including famous people and hometown heroes. 	Discussion Prompt- Say: Think about leaders. Let's make a list of leaders here on the board. Think about people you know from school, home, and after-school activities. Think about people you've seen on TV or heard of from others. Record this list on the board to refer to later. You will use the "Leader List" in future lessons.
CHARACTERISTICS	Slide 2: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Once you have created your list of leaders on the board, ask the questions on Slide 2. Compile the list of leadership characteristics on the same piece of chart paper or on the board beside your list. 	"Based on what we've learned about the leaders on our list, what are some traits that leaders possess?"

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	<p>Slide 3:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> This slide shows the 5 characteristics that are emphasized on your tour. If these were not listed by your students, take a moment to discuss each one and what it means. 	<p>After your discussion of the characteristics SAY:</p> <p>"In the next slides, you will meet individuals on our tour that show one or more of these traits. See if you can figure out which trait(s) each person has."</p>
<p>NATIVE AMERICANS</p>	<p>Slides 4-5:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Show slide 4-5. At slide 5 stop and ask a few questions. You may wish to make a KWL chart to keep for the duration of the unit. KWL Chart is three columns for your students to respond: "What I Know, What I Wonder, What I Learned" Ask the suggested questions 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> What do you know about Native Americans? Do you know the names of any of the people shown in these pictures? (More information about these Oklahoma Hall of Fame Members may be found at the links below)
<p>INFORMATION TE ATA</p>	<p>Slide 6:</p> <p>Our first highlighted Native American is Te Ata. She is a member of the OHOF and has a beautiful story of helping the world see and hear the culture of Native American tribes from around the country.</p>	<p>READ: <u>Te Ata Oklahoma's Cultural Treasure</u> by Pati Hailey aloud to the students. As you read, discuss the different situations she found herself in and compare/contrast her life to the lives of children today. This book may be found in your library.</p> <p>After reading:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Who can tell me what leadership characteristics Te Ata displayed? (Perseverance, Individualism)
<p>INFORMATION JIM THORPE</p>	<p>Slide 7: Ask the suggested questions. Jim Thorpe was an athlete who won gold medals in track and field in the Olympics, was one of the best professional baseball players of his time, and</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> How many of you play a sport? Do you play more than one sport? Can you name a professional athlete that plays more than one sport professionally?

	<p>played professional football for many years.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> After asking the suggested questions, play one or both videos linked on the slide. It is recommended that you view the video before showing it in class. 	<p>After watching:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> What leadership characteristics did Jim Thorpe show?
INFORMATION STANDING BEAR	<p>Slide 8:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> This slide has an optional video link featuring a PBS documentary on the Trail of Tears. It can be used to provide background before meeting our next person of importance, Standing Bear. 	<p>READ: <u>The Trial of Standing Bear</u> by Frank Keating</p> <p>This short story may be found in your library and is a great story of triumph for Native Americans after so many challenges.</p> <p>After reading and discussing the story, ask:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> What leadership traits did Chief Standing Bear portray?
SUMMARY	<p>Slide 9:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> This slide lists two questions for discussion or to be used as a short answer writing assignment to align with OAS PALS 2.A 	<p>Optional- write a paragraph describing a time when you or someone you know "stood up" for what was right even when others were against you. Be sure to write in complete sentences and use descriptive words.</p>
