

LCPOA Committee Composition

The LCPOA Committees are the strength of our association. Our board depends on both standing and ad hoc committees to function efficiently. A standing committee refers to any committee which is needed year-round as opposed to an ad hoc committee that is only needed to complete a particular task. An example of a standing (year-round) committee would be the Road Committee. The Governing Documents Committee is an Ad Hoc Committee because it is only required for a particular purpose ie: to update the governing documents.

Most Committees have a Charter. This is recommended when the Committee is handling critical work for the LCPOA Board. The Charter, while approved by a Board vote, is subject to a rewrite by the Committee itself, followed by Board ratification.

All committees have a Chair and a variable number of members. Each of these positions are approved by a Board vote. In some cases, a Board Liaison is also utilized to facilitate communication with the Board. The Liaison does not have a vote on the Committee, nor do they push an agenda from the Board. All committee members are covered by LCPOA insurance. You will see all committees listed on the monthly open meeting agenda. Each committee chair provides the Board with a report and the minutes from the previous month's meeting for approval. This is an incredible resource for the Board. We depend on the wisdom and recommendations of each Committee. It is my suggestion that anyone who wants to run for a Board of Director's position, should volunteer on a committee first. This is excellent training and affords one much experience that will serve well as a Director.
