Anal fissures, hemorrhoids, post-surgical pain, and chronic anorectal discomfort can be debilitating — and commercial options often fall short. Our compounded **Rectal Rockets** combine three complementary ingredients in a single suppository, used once nightly at bedtime, to address the major drivers of anorectal pain simultaneously: sphincter spasm, inflammation, and pain signaling.

Three Ingredients. One Suppository.

Nitroglycerin

Relaxes Sphincter Spasm

Anal fissures and hemorrhoidal pain are often driven by internal sphincter spasm, which also reduces blood flow and delays healing. Nitroglycerin relaxes the sphincter and increases local blood flow — addressing the root cause, not just the symptom.

Lidocaine

Rapid Pain Relief

A local anesthetic that provides immediate relief from burning, stinging, and pain. Works within minutes of application for fast comfort when you need it most — including before bowel movements.

Hydrocortisone

Reduces Inflammation

A mild corticosteroid that reduces inflammation, swelling, and irritation in the anorectal tissue. Particularly helpful for hemorrhoidal flare-ups and inflammatory anorectal conditions.

How to Use

- 1 Once Nightly at Bedtime**
Insert one suppository rectally just before going to sleep. Bedtime timing allows the medication to work while you're at rest and minimizes any mild lightheadedness from the nitroglycerin.
- 2 Expected Timeline**
Most patients notice pain relief within minutes and meaningful improvement in fissure healing or hemorrhoidal symptoms within 2–4 weeks of consistent use.
- 3 Mild Headache Is Common**
Nitroglycerin can cause a mild headache, especially in the first few nights. This usually fades within a week and can be managed with acetaminophen if needed. Let your doctor know if it persists.
