

Volunteer Coordinator

Duties may include:

- Ensure active participation particularly from those with hearing and sight issues to ensure they're engaged in a meaningful way

Examples of games may include (suggestions welcome):

- "Uncommon Knowledge" and other interactive trivia games
- Wii bowling and other video games
- Brain games

VOLUNTEER FAQ'S (APPENDIX A)



How do I become a volunteer?

- First, you need to complete and submit the Volunteer Application and Consent Form (including Parent/Guardian consent for volunteers that are minors).
- Next, you will need to receive approval from a designated community staff member who will confirm your background check and work with you to identify and schedule your volunteer program.

Will I be trained by community staff prior to volunteering?

Yes, upon your first day of arrival you will go through orientation, which will be led by a
designated community staff member who will cover sign-in/sign-out requirements, planned
activities, schedules, rules, expectations and the policies and procedures in the Volunteer
Handbook.

How do I schedule future volunteer hours if I wish to come back?

• You will need to coordinate with the Activity Director (or another designated staff member) to schedule future volunteer hours and assignments.

Will I be compensated as a volunteer?

Volunteers are not paid (except in smiles!).

Who should I contact to sign off on my volunteer hours?

• The Activity Director (or another designated staff member) will sign off on your volunteer hours.

How can I learn more about potential volunteer opportunities?

 The Starling Stripers Volunteer Packet includes a section on Volunteer Opportunities and Programs for your review. Because certain volunteer opportunities may require additional training, experience or certifications, the Activity Director (or another designated staff member) will need to approve your role ahead of time.

Can I recommend new volunteer programs not currently offered?

• Absolutely. We are always open to finding new ways for volunteers to interact with our residents in a way that matches their interests/skills with the interests/needs of our residents.

Are there special rules that I need to follow when volunteering in a senior living community?

Yes. During orientation, a community staff member will review the Volunteer Handbook which
includes policies and procedures volunteers need to follow that are specific to working with the
elderly, including, in some cases, those with certain impairments (dementia, physical, speech,
sight, hearing, etc.).

Who should I contact if I have more questions?

During orientation, you will be notified which designated staff members will be your point(s) of contact. For general inquiries about the volunteer program, please contact Megan Kennedy at (904) 301-9100.
