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Recent PBPA Committee Activity

Through a joint effort of our Texas Legislative Committee, Regulatory Practices Committee and Electrical Coalition, PBPA has been working to engage with the Railroad Commission of Texas (RRC or Commission) regarding a proposed rulemaking, and associated forms and tables, resulting from Senate Bill 3 and House Bill 3648. As is noted in the Regulatory Update section below, comments on these proposals are due November 1, 2021. Southwest Airlines will continue direct air service from Midland-Odessa to Austin starting in March of 2022! It has been over a decade (2009) since the service was provided. Southwest's announcement comes as part of a restructuring effort where the airline will add 20 new flights per day out of Austin Bergstrom International Airport. New flights will provide a total of 46 non-stop destinations for Southwest out of Austin. The announcement also means that Southwest – in March -- will fly directly out of Midland International Airport to five cities (Dallas, Houston, Las Vegas, Denver and Austin).



Regulatory Updates



Notice To Gas Facility Operators and Gas Pipeline Facility Operators: *Preparation by Operators for Winter 2021-2022*

Senate Bill 3 states the Railroad Commission of Texas (RRC or the Commission) shall require gas supply chain facilities and gas pipeline facilities, respectively, to "implement measures to prepare to operate during a weather emergency." Adoption of the rules is tied to the map to be published by the Texas Electricity Supply Chain Security and Mapping Committee no later than September 1, 2022. Operators of gas supply chain facilities and gas pipeline facilities under the Commission's jurisdiction are expected to take all necessary measures to prepare to operate in extreme weather conditions during the winter season of 2021-2022. The Commission has stated that its highest priority is to ensure that should another extreme winter weather event occur, all available natural gas under the jurisdiction of the Commission in the state is available to be utilized for reliable energy sources for Texans. The Commission is taking additional steps including on-site visits to assess operator preparedness. To ensure that gas facility operators and gas pipeline facility operators are implementing measures to prepare to operate during extreme weather conditions prior to publication of the map, the Commission's Oil and Gas Division and Oversight and Safety Division jointly issue the following best practices for weatherization:

RRC Workshop on Rulemaking Related to the Implementation of Senate Bill 3 and House Bill 3648

On October 5, 2021, the RRC hosted a workshop addressing proposed new rule 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §3.65, relating to Critical Designation of Natural Gas Infrastructure. The proposed rule implements a process for designating certain natural gas entities as critical during an energy emergency as specified in Senate Bill 3 and House Bill 3648 passed by the 87th Legislature (Regular Session). The RRC has also proposed new forms and a table related to this rulemaking. The RRC is accepting public comments on these proposed new forms and table through November 1, 2021.

- Form CI-D, *Acknowledgement of Critical Customer/Critical Gas Supplier Designation*, would be submitted by an operator of a facility designated as critical acknowledging the facility's critical status.
- Form CI-X, *Critical Customer/Critical Gas Supplier Designation Exception Application*, would be submitted by an operator certifying a facility needs an exception to critical designation because the facility is not prepared to operate in a weather emergency.
- Table CCI, specifies the information that an operator is required to submit to electric entities for load shed prioritization.

RRC Hosts PIPES Online Portal Webinar on October 20

The RRC will host a free webinar to inform and train industry and public on the *Pipeline, Inspection, Permitting and Evaluation System (PIPES)* portal. The webinar will be held at 10 a.m. on Wednesday,

October 20, 2021.

RRC PIPES, which launched in July, allows pipeline operators to upload pipeline safety related reports, files, and payments. In addition, the public can go online and access documents in the RRC's pipeline safety inspection process.

The webinar will cover a variety of topics, including overviews of:

- RRC's Access Management Process (RAMP), which manages how authenticated users sign into and receive access to the portal and upload documents for filing in a docket to be reviewed for acceptance by the Hearings Division's Docket Services; and
- RRC PIPES and demonstration of how authenticated users can submit plan of correction documents, the Form PS-48, Form PS-95 reports, integrity notifications and fee payments online.

OCD Seeking ALARM Program Feedback

On October 14, 2021, the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division circulated the following notice regarding their ALARM program:

In accordance with 19.15.27 and 19.15.28 NMAC, operators are incentivized to employ advanced technologies to reduce natural gas waste.

By using an OCD approved technology, operators can obtain credits towards their overall natural gas capture percentage.

As part of OCD's ongoing integrated rule implementation strategy, the OCD is requesting stakeholder feedback on the draft guidance documents posted on OCD's <u>Announcements web page</u>. These illustrate the requirements for approval of advanced technologies and the process for applying for natural gas credits.

The draft guidance for each application is formatted to allow for ease of feedback. It is intended that the official technology application and credit application will be submitted electronically through OCD's e-permitting portal. OCD will issue additional guidance regarding the required format and process for electronic submission at a later date.

OCD will accept stakeholder feedback on the draft files by no later than **COB October 29**, **2021.**

The New Mexico State Land Office has issued their draft<u>Cultural Resources Rule</u>. This has been a rule making that PBPA has been tracking and engaging on through our Regulatory Practices Committee. Comments are due by October 21st followed by a hearing on October 22nd.
