COVID 19

TEXAS - Absent a statewide order to shelter in place in Texas, we recognize that there is a possibility of inconsistency across county lines. We have expressed this concern to local and state officials in Texas. We are working with local officials, and, in particular, the Office of the Governor to ensure that there is consistency for operators of critical infrastructure, including upstream, midstream, and downstream assets to continue on-site or remote attendance by your employees for the health, safety, and welfare of the public, and the environment.

NEW MEXICO - Yesterday (March 23, 2020), New Mexico Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham issued a stay at home order for non-essential workers in the state. The PBPA has had conversations with the Governor's office and we have been given assurances that she considers oil and gas industry operations to be essential businesses in the state. The Governor knows you and your employees may conduct activities in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of people and the environment. No additional signage or recognition is necessary at this time. We'll let you know if any changes to this policy occur.
